Deborah Daro is a Chapin Hall research fellow with more than 20 years of experience in evaluating child abuse treatment and prevention programs. Dr. Daro has directed some of the largest multisite program evaluations completed in the field and has lectured and published widely. Prior to joining Chapin Hall, Dr. Daro served as the director of the National Center on Child Abuse Prevention Research, a program of the National Committee to Prevent Child Abuse. She has served as president of the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children and is currently serving on the executive council of the International Society for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect.

Kay Johnson has been a leader in child health policy for 25 years. She has been active in Medicaid and children's health policy at the federal and state level since 1984 and served as an advisor to more than 40 state health and Medicaid agencies.
