

Budgeting, the Next Generation: Federal and State Investments in Children after ARRA

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Olivia Golden (moderator) is an Institute fellow at the Urban Institute, where her research focuses on the service delivery, leadership, and political strategies human services programs use to help children and families. Previous posts include director of state operations for New York's governor (2007), director of the District of Columbia's Child and Family Services Agency (2001–2004), and assistant secretary for children and families at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (1997–2001). She is the author of *Reforming Child Welfare* (Urban Institute Press, 2009).

Robert Gordon is the associate director for education, income maintenance, and labor at the Office of Management and Budget. Previously, Gordon was a senior fellow at the Center for American Progress and served as a consultant to the Gates Foundation. As a senior adviser to the chancellor of the New York City Department of Education, he led an overhaul of the city's school budgeting system. Gordon also served in the Clinton White House as an aide to the National Economic Council and the Office of National Service, helping craft the legislation creating AmeriCorps.

Julia Isaacs is the child and family policy fellow at the Brookings Institution and a fellow with First Focus. Her research examines investments in children in the federal budget and economic mobility. Before joining Brookings in 2006, she was a division director at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Isaacs has served as a senior researcher on childhood development and school finance at the American Institutes for Research and budget analyst at the Congressional Budget Office.

Austin Smythe is the Republican staff director of the House Budget Committee, where he assists the ranking Republican member of the committee, Wisconsin's Paul Ryan, with the development of legislation to reform federal spending and taxes. Prior to joining the committee, Smythe was the executive associate director at the Office of Management and Budget. He was also a vice president in Lehman Brothers' Washington office, where he monitored and analyzed budget, natural resources, and tax issues for the firm's Equity Research Division. Before that, he served on the staff of the Senate Budget Committee, under the leadership of Senator Pete Domenici.

Eugene Steuerle is an Institute fellow and Richard B. Fisher Chair at the Urban Institute. He has served as vice-president of the Peter G. Peterson Foundation, codirector of the Urban-Brookings Tax Policy Center, deputy assistant secretary of the treasury for tax analysis, president of the National Tax Association, and chair of the 1999 technical panel advising Social Security on its methods and assumptions. Steuerle is the author, coeditor, or editor of 15 books, including *Contemporary U.S. Tax Policy* and *Retooling Social Security for the 21st Century*.
