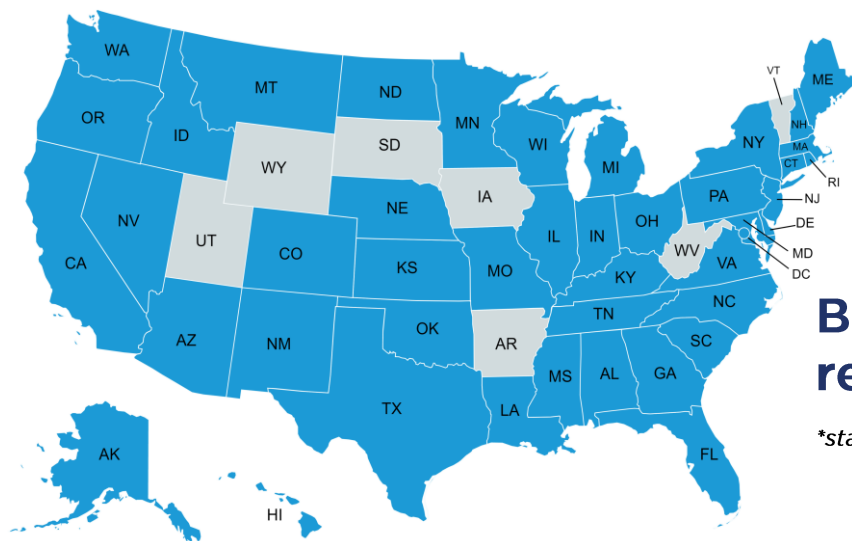


Chapin Hall is a research and policy center focused on the mission of improving the well-being of children, youth, and their families.

1865: Chapin Hall opens as a facility caring for children with working mothers

1985: [Harold Richman](#) leads reconstitution as a research institute at the University of Chicago

2011: [Midwest Study](#) of Adult Functioning of Former Foster Youth increases support for youth aging out of foster care

2013: [Bryan Samuels](#) joins as Executive Director, bringing greater focus on accelerating impact through policy change

2017: [Voices of Youth Count](#) spurs national policy and practice change to address youth homelessness

2021: [Family First Collaboration](#) provides national leadership to decrease the use of long-term foster care
