
# CHAPIN HALL AT THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO

### **Evolution**

**1865:** Chapin Hall opens as a facility caring for children with working mothers

**1985:** Harold Richman leads reconstitution as a research institute at the University of Chicago

**2011:** Midwest Study of Adult Functioning of Former Foster Youth increases support for youth aging out of foster care

**2013:** Bryan Samuels joins as Executive Director, bringing greater focus on accelerating impact through policy change

**2017:** Voices of Youth Count spurs national policy and practice change to address youth homelessness

**2021:** Family First Collaboration provides national leadership to decrease the use of long-term foster care
